## Question of the Week for the 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time:

The committee asked for your prayers as we plan for this major fundraiser. We learned a great deal last year. Once again we thank each of you for your understanding, cooperation, hard work, and support.

The St. Michael's Picnic Committee had its first meeting June 6, 2017, in the church basement. Father Aaron was present to offer his support, and he thanked the committee for its dedication and service. Committee members present were our chair, Jeanne Schroeder, Bob Book, Jo Thrasher, and Will Bishop. Tom Casper will continue to serve as a committee member this year, but he was absent from this meeting. Gary Geswein who served on the committee many years has retired. The committee applauds Gary for his service especially his work planning the outside layout, tent procurement, and tent set-up and tear-down as well as his work with acquiring donations and sponsors. Gary was knowledgeable of many aspects of the picnic. He and Bob developed the successful Pedal Tractor Pull. Gary will be missed, but we all will see him working at the Picnic. Our 2017 church picnic will be held September 24. A notice will be put in the church bulletin asking all to save that date and be prepared to work.

The picnic committee is interested in adding more activities if parish support is provided. All practical, appropriate ideas will be considered. The committee is looking for activities to attract all age groups. (Possibly a beer garden, talent show, or some new youth activities could be added.)
